When filing an Application for License, enclose the following:

- 1. Completed, signed Application for License;
- 2. Proof of Citizenship or lawful permanent residency status in the United States of America (USA) or Canada;
- 3. Proof of licensure in good standing with one or more NCARB Member Board(s) signatory to the current Agreement (template attached);
- 4. Signed affidavit attesting to the completion of 2,000 cumulative hours of post-licensure experience, practicing as an architect in the USA (template attached);
- 5. Payment of applicable fees. (Refer to Payment of Fees Form);

You are advised to notify the ALBNL <u>in writing in advance of</u> being considered for a commission in Newfoundland and Labrador. You must also promise to comply with the requirements for licensing immediately upon obtaining the commission. This avoids the perception that you are trying to practice architecture without a license in Newfoundland and Labrador.

IMPORTANT

Newfoundland and Labrador has single tier licensing. You must obtain a license for yourself (individual) to offer or provide architectural services to the public.

Offering or providing architectural services before getting your license will make you ineligible for a license to practice in Newfoundland and Labrador.

GENERAL:

- 1. **PROCESSING** takes **4 5 weeks** from the date of receipt. The forms must be complete with all the required documentation. Applications received in July and August may take longer.
- 2. **APPLICATIONS** should be <u>typed or printed in English</u>. The terms "Not Applicable" and "N/A" may be used where sections do not apply.
- 3. **VERIFICATION** all documentation submitted will be verified.
- 4. **LICENSE TERM** January 1 to December 31 each year. **Applications received after December 1** will not be finalized in that calendar year (unless otherwise requested) and must include the appropriate fees for the following year.

5. **SEAL:**

- a. Article 13 of the ALBNL Architects Act 2008 permits any firm to provide architectural services provided such services are offered and provided under the direct supervision of an architect. The Code of Ethics requires an architect providing the required direct supervision to a firm or any partnership or joint venture to which the firm is a member of, (1) to be either an employee or a contract employee of the firm, (2) notify the Board in advance of when such direction supervision will commence, (3) notify the Board immediately when such direct supervision ceases; and (4) limit such direct supervision to one firm and any partnership or joint venture to which the firm is a member of.
- b. The seal is to be applied to all documents prepared under the licensed holder's direct supervision and issued to any authority for approval, including the Planning Department submissions, and all documents issued for Construction and Supplementary Drawings. The seal remains the property of the ALBNL and is to be returned immediately upon request.
- c. Under the ALBNL Code of Ethics a license holder is required to notify the Registrar and complete and submit the Notice of Termination of Employment Form immediately upon termination of employment of a Firm.
- CERTIFICATE Every holder of a license shall keep his/her license certificate prominently displayed in his/her place of business.
- 7. **MANDATORY CONTINUING EDUCATION/PROFESSIONAL DEVELOPMENT** The ALBNL has a <u>mandatory</u> Continuing Education program and detailed information can be found on the ALBNL's Web site <u>www.albnl.com</u>.

8. **PROFESSIONAL LIABILITY INSURANCE:**

- a. As a condition of holding a license to practice architecture in Newfoundland and Labrador, the license holder must maintain professional liability insurance at all times. If, at any time, the license holder is not covered by insurance he/she must cease practicing immediately until such time as insurance is reinstated, and to notify the ALBNL immediately.
- b. The Professional Liability Insurance Certificate must name the Insurance Company, Policy Number, Policy Expiry date; the Policy must have coverage of not less than \$250,00 per claim and not less than \$500,00 in the aggregate; must specifically indicate that the Insurance company shall notify the ALBNL if and when the policy lapses, is cancelled, or is not renewed (30 days' notice is required); the Insurance Company must be licensed with the Government of Newfoundland and Labrador to offer insurance

products in the province.

9. **FEES**

There are Application Fees and Annual Fees for each license and license renewal: The application and annual fees for License and License Renewal are set out on a Payment of Fees Form which is included on page 10 of this document.

COMPLETION OF THE APPLICATION

A. IDENTIFICATION

QUESTION 7 (seven) requires proof of your date of birth. Photocopies of birth certificate, passport or driver's license are accepted.

B. LICENCE HISTORY

Indicate license status in all jurisdictions where a license is <u>currently</u> held or was <u>previously</u> held. Identify any license not currently in good standing and give the particulars. Attach supplementary sheets if necessary.

C. DECLARATION

It is the statutory responsibility of the ALBNL to ensure that applicants for license in Newfoundland and Labrador have the requisite knowledge of NL <u>laws and regulations</u> before being granted a license by the ALBNL.

Applicants must have unrestricted access to all of the documents listed in Appendix 1. The ALBNL Official Documents are only available for downloading from the ALBNL's Web site.

MOBILITY OF ARCHITECTS TO NEWFOUNDLAND AND LABRADOR

Sometimes clients want you to start work in Newfoundland and Labrador or provide design ideas, programming or other architectural services before you are licensed in NL.

ARCHITECTURAL SERVICES IN NEWFOUNDLAND AND LABRADOR can only be provided by an <u>Architect licensed by the</u> ALBNL.

COMMISSIONS – You are advised to notify the ALBNL in writing in advance of pursuit of a commission in Newfoundland and Labrador. You must also promise to comply with the requirements for licensing immediately upon obtaining the commission. This avoids the perception that you are trying to offer services or practice architecture without a license in NL.

COLLABORATION AND TEMPORARY LICENCES – Not Applicable.

APPENDIX 2

Excerpts from the MUTUAL RECOGNITION AGREEMENT (CANADA/USA)

The following is a summary of the requirements as set out in the Mutual Recognition Agreement between the National Council of Architectural Registration Boards (NCARB) and the Canadian Architectural Licensing Authorities (CALA) which took effect January 1, 2014 in Newfoundland and Labrador, Canada.

1. Mutual Recognition Agreement

Definitions:

- (a) **Demonstration of Required Experience:** 2,000 cumulative hours of post-licensure experience shall be demonstrated by individual applicants through the provision of proof of licensure in good standing and a signed affidavit attesting to the experience.
- (b) **Principal Place of Practice:** The address declared by the architect to be the address at which the architect is predominantly offering architectural services. The architect may only identify one principal place of practice.
- (c) **Limitations:** Nothing in this Agreement limits the ability of an NCARB Member Board or CALA jurisdiction to refuse to license/register an architect or impose terms, conditions or restrictions on his/her license/registration.

2. Eligibility and Conditions

All applicants for registration in the Province of Newfoundland and Labrador must comply with the local requirements.

A. Eligibility

- (1) Architects who are able to benefit from the provisions of this agreement must be citizens respectively of the United States or Canada or have lawful permanent residency status in that country as their home country in order to seek licensure/registration in the other country as the host country under this Agreement. Architects shall not be required to establish citizenship or permanent residency status in the host country in which they seek licensure/registration under this Agreement.
- (2) Architects must also be licensed/registered in a jurisdiction of their home country and must have completed at least 2,000 hours of post-licensure/registration experience practicing as an architect in their home country.
- (3) Architects who have been licensed by means of a Broadly Experienced Foreign Architect program of either two countries or other foreign reciprocal licensing agreement are not eligible under this agreement.

B. Conditions

<u>US Architect to Canadian Jurisdiction:</u> Upon application, those CALA jurisdictions who are signatories to this Agreement and so long as they remain signatories agree to license/register as an architect in their respective province or territory any architect who:

- 1. Is currently licensed/registered in good standing by one or more NCARB Member Board(s) that is a current signatory to this Agreement;
- 2. Holds a current NCARB Certificate;
- 3. Meets the eligibility requirements listed above; and
- 4. Whose principal place of practice is in a jurisdiction that is a current signatory to this Agreement

C. Applicant Must Provide:

- 1. a letter of good standing from the architectural licensing authority in the architect's principal place of practice (template attached);
- 2. a letter of declaration from the applicant attesting to at least 2,000 hours of post-licensure experience (template attached);
- 3. proof of citizenship/permanent residency in the home country; and
- 4. a current NCARB Certificate.

3. Practice (Certificate of Practice for the Individual)

- 1. (a) To promote, offer or provide architectural services in Newfoundland and Labrador, a registered architect must apply for and have approved a Certificate of Practice .
 - (b) In order to obtain and continue to hold a Certificate of Practice, a registered architect under the Mutual Recognition Agreement must maintain his/her Principal Place of Practice in a jurisdiction which allows an ALBNL member to become registered on a reciprocal basis.
 - (c) In order to hold a Certificate of Practice, a registered architect is subject to the local requirements including those relating to professional liability insurance coverage.
- 2. Permissible forms of practice are set out in the *Architects Act*, 2008, SNL2008 A-15.1 and Regulations 10o5/10. Information is available from the ALBNL office at 709.726.8550 or email: albnl@albnl.com.
