1. Thursday June 30, 2022 CEP Cycle 9 will close at the stroke of midnight. License Holders and Intern Architects will no longer have access to posting additional learning hours into Cycle 9 once the cycle is officially closed and locked. This bulletin serves as your official notice.

4. The number of Learning Hours that must be collected during Cycle 9:
  - a. License Holders:
    - CORE: 25
    - Self-Directed: 45
  - b. Intern Architects:
    - CORE: 12.5
    - Self-Directed: 22.5
  
5. The maximum possible Carry Over Learning Hours from Cycle 9 into Cycle 10
  - License Holders:  
8.0 CORE and 8.0 Self-Directed, and
  - Intern Architects:  
4.0 CORE and 4.0 Self-Directed.
  
6. For individuals who have approved Carry Over Learning Hours in Cycle 9, the hours will be carried into Cycle 10 and cannot be used in another Cycle.
  
7. License Holders and Intern Architects who are deemed deficient at the end of Cycle 9 will be subject to a fee in accordance with the ALBNL Mandatory CEP Enforcement Process. This document is available on the ALBNL Website.

8. Carry Over Learning Hours will only be considered at the audit following the June 30<sup>th</sup> deadline. Individuals deficient in mandatory hours for CORE and Self-Directed categories can use the Six-month Grace Period to obtain the missing hours, following the close of the Cycle end, however, Carry Over Learning Hours will not be considered after the audit.
  
9. Posting Learning Hour activities over the maximum amount required in both CORE and Self-Directed categories will be capped at the maximum permitted for each category; anything posted after the maximum and permitted carry over amounts cannot be used.

12. To be audited, License Holders and Intern Architects are required to report individual entries for each individual learning activity, including identification of the actual date the activity occurred (not the date of the entry), title, provider, and type. Multiple activities shall not be grouped into a single activity entry or type, or any other grouping.
13. Service Groups cannot be used for Committee and Discussion Group categories, except where it can be shown to have relevant architectural application.
14. “Multimedia” includes listening to audio books and podcasts, watching documentaries and videos, reading of books, periodicals, or journals related to the business or practice of Architecture. Individuals are reminded not to group activities or reading under one entry. Doing so, may result in the loss of logged hours at the discretion of the Audit Committee.
15. The audit will commence at the close of Cycle 9. For audit purposes, supporting documentation must be maintained for all educational activities completed during the Cycle for a period of 2 years after the Cycle end and shall submit such documentation to the ALBNI only upon request.
16. License Holders and Intern Architects have the option to seek recognition or equivalency for learning activities completed during the Continuing Educational Cycle, if the learning activity focuses on one of the CORE topics established by the ALBNI. The form titled “Request for Equivalency of a Continuing Education Activity” shall be completed by those seeking recognition or equivalency and submitted to the CEP Committee for review, and is available at this link: <https://www.albni.com/documents/wp-content/uploads/2021/01/ALBNI-CEP-Request-for-Equivalency-Cycle-9.pdf>
17. CORE and Self-Directed Learning Hour activities can be posted at <https://ces.albni.com/>; login with your assigned username and password and go to Record Hours.
18. CORE Pre-approved Program Providers
  - Education Provider Program (EPP): A list of Registered Education Providers and Approved Courses, visit the EPP website: <https://epp.aanb.org/en/approved-providers>.
  - RAIC: Modules offered by the Royal Architectural Institute of Canada (RAIC) and deemed to be CORE learning by the RAIC.
  - Provincial Architectural Associations: Modules offered by other Provincial Architectural Associations and deemed to be CORE learning in that jurisdiction.

- AIA: Modules offered through the American Institute of Architects (AIA) that are within the streams of Health, Safety and Welfare (HSW) and Sustainable Design (SD). CEPs approved by AIA under these two categories can be reported as CORE or others as approved by the Audit Committee. If the course is approved by AIA but not designated as HSW or SD, please report it as Self-Directed learning. *The ALBNL accepts only AIA courses that are supported by a certificate of completion. Note that an AIA transcript is not considered a legitimate proof of attendance.*
- NLAA: Modules offered by the Newfoundland and Labrador Association of Architects (NLAA) and deemed to be CORE Learning by our jurisdiction.
